The purpose of the Grey Literature Report will be to provide information about 'fugitive' publications in the subjects of Health Policy, Public Health and related subjects as they acquired by the Academy, and to create a database of these publications for future use and access.

The publications announced here are those published by research institutions and government agencies, rather than commercial publishers. The documents include research reports, statistical publications, proceedings, and other documents recently obtained by the New York Academy of Medicine Library. Links to many of the organizations from whom the Library receives these publications are provided. Included in this issue are publications produced from 1998 to the present only, except in rare instances. If the item is also published electronically, or if there is an information page about the item, the link will be included when known.
